

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In the last quarter, the project achieved significant milestones despite facing major challenges. In particular, a protracted delay in validation of the project account seriously delayed implementation of major activities. Nonetheless, procurement of contractor for the Nari Gorge scheme was completed, along with hiring of Environment, Gender and Procurement specialists. The contractor initiated start-up activities of the NariGorge scheme. The two World Bank Implementation Support Missions (ISMs) visited the PMU, and were critical to securing account validationand developing Environmental and Social Management Plans (ESMP) for the two priority schemes. The missions heldmeetings with the Secretaries of Agriculture, Irrigation and Forest departments. The team conducted contract negotiations for the PSIA consultancy firm and short-listed consultants for the project M&E. The contract negotiations for hiring of Accountancy firms for external audit regarding retroactive financing and internal audit reached the final stage. Procurement of field equipment's for the Forest Department were finalized. The task of hiring a national consultant for hydro-meteorological data collection and monitoring was entrusted to the PSIA consultants.

The Terms of Reference (TOR) for On-farm Water Management (OFWM) and forest teams were developed and sent to the Forest Department for issuance of notifications. The TORs for watershed management and rangeland management assessment studies/surveys for the six sites in the river basin and scheme levels were prepared and submitted to the Forest Department for review. The Forest Department initiated the work by developing a budget for seedling propagation. Meanwhile, specifications for procurement of the field equipment's for watershed management were finalized. Meetings for formation of Farmers' Organizations (FOs) were held in the Nari and Poraliriver basins. Meetings were organized for formation of Water Users' Associations (WUAs) for the ten watercourses in the NariRiver Basin.

The Auditor General of Pakistan (AGP) completed the external audit for 2016-2017. The Secretary Irrigation constituted a new GrievanceRedressalCommittee (GRC) under the chairmanship of Chief Engineer North, Irrigation department.

PHYSICAL PROGRESS

Project Management and Technical Assistance (Component C)

The contract agreements for the NariGorge integrated scheme and for Environment, Gender and Procurement specialists were signed during the reporting quarter (July-September). World Bank's implementation support missions (ISM) visited the PMU on July18-20 and August29-30. The missions assessed the project situation related to the delay in account validation and shared comprehensive feedback on development of the Environmental and Social Management Plan (ESMP). The mission met with the Secretaries of Agriculture, Irrigation and Forest departments.

Sub-Component C1

The three positions of the individual consultants were filled-in by;Mr. Maqsood Ahmed-Environment Specialist,Ms. Sara Khan-Gender Development Specialist, and Mr. NaseerMengal-Procurement Specialist. The details of roles and responsibilities are provided in section "Project Staffing and PMU/PIU Operations Manual". The procurement for renting vehicles and purchasing office equipment's for the OFWM field teams was initiated and this component is almost on target.

This component is well-below target. Delayed hiring of Procurement Specialist has slowed procurement progress considerably.

COMMUNICATIONS AND PROJECT RISKS

The communications developed the draft communications strategy and five-year work plan document and shared it with the project director and IDA Senior Communications Officer for review and feedback. The project website was reviewed and the heading of *News*, which accommodates news, events and photographs, was included in the website menu. The project photos and activities' news and updates were regularly updated on website. The communications specialist meanwhile translated the select content from English to Urdu for development of miscellaneous IEC material and continued documentation of the project activities. The communications also explored options for hiring services of a designer for designing of the communication products.

The delay in convening a steering committee meeting may pose a considerable risk to project implementation. The freezing of the project account resulted in overall halting of the activities resulting in slow progress. Delay in hiring of M&E Consultants has delayed project monitoring.

MONITORING & EVALUATION

M&E developed and finalized two quarterlyprogress reports and sent these to the Bank for review and approval. Both reports approved and sent to the government authorities for information and progress update. Hiring of M&E consultants is still under process.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL STATUS

The Secretary Irrigation constituted a new Grievance RedressalCommittee (GRC) under the chairmanship of Chief Engineer North, Irrigation department, to address grievances against the PMU.

As, the project is heading speedily to meet-up the initial tasks, encountering issues and complications to move the activities on fast-track such as; (1) Hiring of key staff and specialists in the PMU (2) Process and hiring of PSIA consultants (3) Initiation of short-listing of M&E consultants (4) Fast track procurement and (5) Process to award civil works contract to the selected contractor.

FORWARD LOOK

- 1. The project intends to modify the Project Operations Manual (POM) and Work Plan.
- 2. The project plans to procure satellite imagery for Nari Gorge and Gundacha schemes for better planning and monitoring.
- 3. Rigorous implementation of project activities following the work plan.
